a new form of government with democracy. Even though late Qing reform was carried out, it was regarded as a fake reform with no real practice of democracy. Socially, the 1911 revolution was a blow to traditional customs such as having pig tails. Confucianism was challenged. Liberated and western ideas were introduced which strengthened China. Diplomatically, after the 1911 revolution, China was able to regain concessions lost to colonial powers and cancelled extra territorial rights which the international status of China raised which the late Qing reform failed to accomplish.

Because of the failure of late Qing Reform and the ^{more} modernised practice of government of China after 1911 Revolution, it is true to say revolutions are violent but effective to strengthen China.

It is true to say in the period 1945 - 2000, European countries became less dependent on the superpowers and more autonomous in their economic cooperation.

After WWII, European countries were still dependent on the two superpowers, USA and USSR under the Marshall Plan and Molotov Plan. In 1948, the USA announced the Marshall Plan to provide economic assistance to European countries. Organisation of European Economic Community (OEEC) was set up to distribute American Aids and to promote trade. On the other hand, in 1949, the USSR announced the Molotov Plan to provide economic assistance to Eastern European countries. Under these two plans, European countries were still dependent on the two superpowers and were not autonomous in their economic cooperation.

However, in later years, Western Europe became less dependent on USA and more

autonomous by setting up their own economic cooperation organisations.

In 1948, Benelux Union was set up to promote free flow of goods, resources and manpowers by Belgium, Netherlands and Luxembourg. It was a small scale of European economic cooperation by three European countries without reliance on USA.

In 1952, due to the successfulness of Benelux Union, 6 European countries, France, West Germany, Italy, with 3 Benelux Union's countries set up the European Coal and Steel Community to expand their cooperation to coal and steel production. Later, in 1958, EURATOM and European Economic Community were also set up to further expand their field of cooperation to nuclear power and open a common market within member nations. These organisations were fully operated by the six European countries with no American influence.

Meanwhile other European countries led by Britain also set up European Free Trade Area for economic cooperation. Internal tariffs were unified to encourage trading within member nations. Similarly, USA did not joined in the organisation. It shows that Western European countries had become less dependent on one of the super-powers, USA and more autonomous.

In 1960s, European Community was set up to merge ECSC, EURATOM and EEC together. Later in 1970s, more European countries joined the EC such as Britain. Still, no American influence were affecting their economic cooperation.

On the Eastern Europe side, however, Eastern European countries were still dependent on USSR. Though Western Europe became less dependent on USA and more autonomy, Eastern European countries were still depending on USSR as they were not allowed to

joined the above organisations I mentioned, until 1990s, when the USSR dissolved.

In 1991, USSR dissolved and many Eastern European countries turned back to capitalist bloc. In 1993, EC renamed to European Union to expand their cooperation to non-economic area. Many Eastern European countries who were freed from Soviet influence joined the EU for further economic cooperation. In 1990s, both East and Western European were not dependent on the superpowers, USA and USSR. Both Marshall Plan and Molotov Plan ended which also marked that European countries were no longer dependent and rely on the superpowers. Also, the setting up of different European economic cooperation organisations marked that European countries were becoming more autonomous in their economic cooperation.

To conclude, in the period 1945-2000,

European countries were becoming less dependent on superpowers and more autonomous in their economic cooperation as there were less and less influence from superpowers to European countries throughout the development of European economic cooperation in 1945 to 2000.

Comments

In Paper 2, the candidate provided logical answers to the questions, despite occasional weak points in the answer to Q.4.
